Promoting WHS values of Whānau and Excellence: To promote our school values of Whānau and Excellence we want to create more time for students to build relationships with their peers/teachers and to have more focus on learning. This means, students' mobile phones and ear buds must be in the student's school bag during class time. There are noted exceptions for individual learners with assistive technology needs and some specific learning activities. Whānau are asked not to text or phone students during class time and in an emergency they should contact Student Services.

Sports registration: Sign up for sports in 2025 at sporty.co.nz/whs. Our Sports Department recommends early registration to ensure that you don't miss out on information at the start of Term 1.

Science & Mathematics: In Years 9 and 10, Science and Mathematics use online platforms to support students' learning. In order to purchase a subscription to these platforms, we need to ask students for a voluntary contribution of \$24 for the year for Stile (Science) and \$25 for Education Perfect (Mathematics). Invoices: Wellington High School asks for a general donation towards the running costs of the school as well as donations to cover activities, materials and other aspects of the school's programme. Invoices will be sent to you during the year. Student Services office staff are happy to discuss payment options with you. There may be other ways in which we can support you. Please discuss with either of your student's Deans.

Payments: You will be able to make payments online for your student from 21 January 2025.

Internet banking: Include the student's name and a reference e.g. 'Stile' or 'Donation' in the details. Bank account ASB bank 12-3141-0212924-00. Please ensure that the payee name is Wellington High School and Com Ed Centre.

Credit card: You can also pay by credit card by phoning Terese on 04-385 8911 extension 872 between 9am-3pm.

In person: If paying in person at Student Services EFTPOS is available and cash payments (exact money preferred) are also accepted. Phone and in person payments at Student Services will be possible from 29 January 2025.

Absences:

Daily absences- reporting through the app, by email (absences@whs.school.nz) or by phoning the absences line 043858911 ext 873.

Requests for exceptional leave (planned but not medical), must be made to the Principal (admin@whs.school.nz).

Lockers: Lockers are not compulsory but are available for \$10 for the year. On receipt of payment (which can be made in person using an EFTPOS card, or via online banking) students will be assigned a locker and will be

given a combination lock. Students will be given the opportunity to sign up for lockers during the orientation programme on Wednesday 29 and Thursday 30 January.

ID cards: ID photos are taken during school photo days on 13 and 14 February. ID cards are ordered from Student Services. A standard ID card costs \$10 and ID cards with Snapper functionality integrated cost \$25. Students can use ID cards with school printers.

Student Services: Located in Main Block Level 5, Student Services take care of much of the administration of the school. Student Services will be open for parents and caregivers from 9.30-2.30pm on 30 January. Further details of term-time opening hours can be found on the school's website.

Cafeteria: The cafeteria will be open from Wednesday 29 January.
